Nomination students	<p>The home university nominates students by email to interof@chnu.edu.ua including the following information and documents:</p> <p><i>first and last name as it appears in the passport, student's email address,</i> <i>semester/s student is nominated for,</i> <i>official name of home university,</i> <i>field/s and level of study</i></p> <p>BA/MA/PhD: learning agreement signed by home university PhD/research master: letter of supervision signed by CHNU professor</p> <p>Nomination deadlines depend on the programmes the students are applying for.</p>	
Nomination staff	CHNU can accept nominations of incoming staff during the whole grant period. Depending on the length of the visa application process in the applicant's country, a nomination 4-6 months in advance of the beginning of the actual stay is recommended.	
Fields of Study Overview	CHNU has 17 000 students, 1 200 professors, 12 faculties, 2 institutes, 89 departments and 12 research centers. We offer BA, MA and PhD degrees (80 BA majors, 73 MA majors and 25 PhD majors) which are open to exchange students: http://en.chnu.edu.ua/study	
International activity	CHNU has 158 inter-institutional agreements and 27 agreements with higher educational institutions (Poland, Romania, Germany, Austria, the Netherlands, France, the Czech Republic, the Slovak Republic, Norway, Lithuania, Spain, Greece, Bulgaria, Austria) within ERASMUS+.	
Housing for students Rent & Living Costs	Erasmus+ International students can stay at the CHNU University hotel (living costs amount to approx.2400 UAH per month) or rent an apartment independently in Chernivtsi.	
Housing for staff	Teaching/ Training Staff can stay the CHNU University hotel (living costs amount to approx.2400 UAH per month) or rent an apartment or a hotel independently in Chernivtsi.	
Language Requirements for students	Yuriy Fedkovich Chernivtsi National University recommends level B2 in English or B2 in Ukrainian.	
Language Requirements for staff	Yuriy Fedkovich Chernivtsi National University recommends level B2 in English in or B2 in Ukrainian.	

Visa & Residence Permit	If a student or a Teaching/ Training staff member stays in Ukraine for longer than 3 months, she/he is required to obtain a visa and a temporary residence permit.																															
Health Insurance	<p>Students: According to the programme guidelines of E+ ICM, insurance coverage is mandatory. A student obtains national insurance before arriving in Ukraine in order to get a visa. However, upon arrival it is mandatory to obtain Ukrainian long-term insurance to get a temporary residence permit.</p> <p>Staff: Teaching/ Training staff members are free to use their national insurance unless they are staying in Ukraine for longer than 3 months.</p>																															
Transcripts	The Transcript is based on the original proofs and certificates issued by the respective course instructor, to be kept by the student him/herself and being the legal proof of participation in the given courses. The Transcript of records is issued by the International Office at the end of the mobility after being signed by the professors who taught the respective courses and the head of International Office. The hard copy is provided to the student at the end of mobility before his/her departure.
